Jame is a talented and experienced track cyclist with speed and all-around abilities, and is an eight-time World Championship team member, Jame competed in the 1992 Barcelona Games and the 2000 Sydney Games, and has also won multiple national championship titles. 2005 got off to an impressive start with a scratch race victory at the World Cup opener in Moscow.

A 1987 graduate of Palmer High School in Colorado Springs, Jame enjoys an active lifestyle, hiking and watching other sports. He married his wife, Debra, on October 12, 2002. How He Got Here

Jame watched his father compete on the road and track when he was young. By age eight, he obtained his first USCF license. He won his first race, and hasn't stopped pedaling since. Jame was first in the points race at the USCF Junior National Track Cycling Championships in 1986.

Did You Know?

- While Jame was still in high school, he was invited to live and train at the Olympic Training Center. He finished high school in Colorado Springs in 1987, his first year on the national team
- Jame partnered with Brian Whitcomb to win the silver at the 1999 Pan Am Games. This was the first major international medal for the U.S. in that event
- He was 1989, 1990, 1999, and 2003 Rider of the Year at Leigh County (PA) Velodrome
