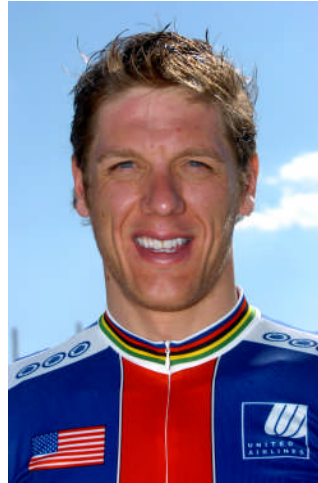

Introduction

As one of the most recognized names in cycling, Marty Nothstein has 35 gold medals in USCF National Championships. At the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney, Marty became the first American cyclist in 16 years to win a gold medal when he claimed victory in the match sprint. The three-time World Track Cycling Champion began concentrating on road and criterium racing in 2002, but focused again on the track as he wore the red, white, and blue at the Athens Olympic Games last summer.

Personal

A 1989 graduate of Emmaus High School, Marty is married to his wife Christi. The couple lives in Pennsylvania and has two children, a son, Tyler and a daughter, Devon. The family also has 2 labs – Rex and Darby.

Favorite Pastimes

In high school, Marty competed in BMX racing, football, baseball and wrestling. Nowadays, he enjoys hiking, hunting, and fishing, but mostly enjoys spending time with his wife and children. He is also a licensed NHRA drag racer and can post a 7.9 ¼ mile.

How He Got Here

Marty began cycling in 1987. He made his debut in 1989 at the World Cycling Championships in Lyon, France. After a successful career at the Olympic level in the sprint event, Marty turned his efforts to road cycling as a member of the Navigators Professional Cycling Team. After a couple of years on the road, Marty took his most impressive victory to date, a win at the New York City Cycling Championships criterium last August. Now, in this Olympic year, Marty has returned his focus to the track, but has switched from the sprint events to the more endurance oriented keirin event.

Did You Know?

- Marty became the first track cyclist in Pan American Games history to win three gold medals in one year
- Marty was named 1999 Visa/USA Cycling Elite Male Track Athlete of the Year
- Marty is nicknamed "The Blade" because he can come around at the last minute and win by razor-thin margins
- Marty's great grandfather was a turn of the century bike racer
