PRE-RIDE/COURSE INSPECTION

Stage 1—SOC's Downhill course—inspection and practice is scheduled for Thursday, April 16 at 7 a.m. Must have your Enduro race number on your bike to inspect/practice.

ENDURO EQUIPMENT REQUIREMENTS

As with other Sea Otter Classic competitions, all riders must wear a helmet during the competition. Bikes must have at least one working brake. All other USA Cycling rules of racing apply.

RACE FORMAT

Each of the four stages will be run as an individual time trial format. The racer with the fastest time for all four stages combined wins the event. There will be untimed transition stages that require pedaling to the next stage. Shuttles are not allowed.

Course map will be posted on or before January 15, 2015.

- Stage one is our Downhill course. Inspection and practice of this segment is scheduled for Thursday at 7:00 a.m.
- Stages two and three are part of our CAT 1/2 Cross-Country course.
- Stage four, the finish of the event, will include the Dual Slalom course.
- Each stage will be clearly marked with "ENDURO START" and "ENDURO FINISH" signs/yellow arrows.

A rider's time on any stage will be chip-timed. Riders will have a window in which to complete all the stages/timed segments. If you miss the time allocated, you will not be eligible for category awards, but you will be listed in the results. No one will be assigned a "did not finish"/DNF.

Completion of timed stages is based on the honor system—riders are required to start and end their stage as it is marked. Random checks will be made before final results are posted. Cutting of the course is strictly prohibited, and riders are required to stay on marked trails. Above all, in addition to following the written rules, everyone is expected to follow the unwritten rules defining sportsmanship and fair play—in other words, do the right thing.

- The CAT 1/CAT 2 Cross-Country course includes a long singletrack descent on the famous "Goat" Trail, TR 41. The first few miles of the course are fire road/doubletrack—Lookout Ridge Road—but will divert to a pavement section (Barloy Canyon Rd). CAT 1, 2, and 3 Cross-Country racers will finish near the Dual Slalom. Check out the map, turn-by-turn directions. CAT 1 (expert) racers and CAT 2 (intermediate), all age groups, will do one lap of the course—24 miles/3,500 feet of climbing. All CAT 3 (beginning) racers complete one lap of their course for a total of +/- 18 miles/2,700 feet of climbing.

When training for competitive events, please share the trail and yield to other users. And as a reminder, e bikes are considered motorized vehicles, and are not allowed on Fort Ord National Monument trails or roadways.



Online registration closes at 11:59 p.m. (PST) Sunday, April 12, 2015.

Saturday and Sunday, April 18-19, 2015

The Downhill course will continue to place a priority on athlete fitness, precision handling, braking, and pedaling skills. Over the years, the Downhill at Sea Otter has tested the world's best; sometimes it's the conditions as much as the course. The Downhill course consists of a great mix of jumps, turns, pedaling sections, hi-rev speed traps, and a challenge or two on the way down!

ENTRY FEES

- Professional entry fee: \$75. (Add \$20 after 11:59 p.m. PST on March 29, 2015.)
- Non-pro entry fee: \$65. (Add \$20 after 11:59 p.m. PST on March 29, 2015.)
- Sorry, absolutely no refunds.

ON-SITE REGISTRATION AND PACKET PICK-UP HOURS

- Wednesday, noon to 6 p.m.
- . Thursday-Friday, 7 a.m. to 6 p.m.
- Saturday, 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., registration and packet pick-up for CAT 1 only.
- Sunday, 7 a.m. to noon, no registration; CAT 1 packet pick-up only.
- No race-day registration—no exceptions. (Pre-registered athletes may pick up their packets on the day of their race.)

IMPORTANT REGISTRATION INFO

- Field is limited to 1,000 riders. Please register early. In the case of small fields, the categories/classes may be combined.
- No race-day registration. You must register no later than the day prior to your race day, by 6 p.m.
- . This race is USA Cycling sanctioned. All USA Cycling rules of racing and license requirements apply.
- CAT 2 or CAT 3 racers must have a valid USA Cycling racing license. This can be an annual license (which can only be purchased at www.usacycling.org), or pay a \$10 one-day license fee at on-site registration/packet pick-up.
- Money from licenses helps support the maintenance and growth of competitive cycling in the United States. Portions of the license fees help provide support for
 programs such as athlete development, race director education, and medical insurance for riders injured at USA Cycling sanctioned events.

IMPORTANT REGISTRATION INFORMATION FOR ALL SOC RACES

- Competitor racing age is determined by the age of the rider on December 31, 2015. Please take care to register for the correct age group, or you will be moved to the correct age group prior to race day.
- Online registrations only through April 12, 2015, 11:59 p.m.
- On-site registration begins at noon on April 15, 2015.
- No phoned, faxed, or mailed race registrations will be accepted.
- · Entries are accepted on a first-come, first-served basis.
- Prior to April 12, 2015, requests for event changes, and for category changes within an event, will be complimentary and can be done by emailing frosty@seaotterclassic.com. You will be responsible for any increase in entry fee. There will be no refunds for reduced entry fees.
- Beginning April 15, 2015, requests for event changes, and for category changes within an event, will only be accepted on-site at registration.
 (Registration opens at noon on April 15.) A \$10 fee will be charged for each event change, and you will also be responsible for any increase in entry fee. There will be no refunds for reduced entry fees.

ADDITIONAL INFORMATION

- · There will be no qualifying runs for any race category.
- On or before your race day, start lists will be posted at the Downhill start, Downhill finish, and at athlete registration. Times shown on the start list are not time of day.

Instead, they are based on the amount of time that passes after the race begins. A start time listed as 1:30 means that you start one hour and thirty minutes after the race begins. There will be 30-second start intervals for all categories.

- Professional riders will be seeded based on final results in the 2014 USA Cycling Mountain Bike National Championships/current 2015 Union Cycliste Internationale Downhill standings/rankings.
- Athlete shuttle vehicles are provided during race times and during all practice times (see schedule).
- No private shuttles are allowed. Riders hooking rides back to start on other than the SOC-provided official athlete shuttle vehicles will be disqualified (zero tolerance).
- · Full-face helmets are suggested for Downhill racers.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR ALL SOC RACES

- · ANSI- or Snell-approved helmets required for all events.
- · All regulations from the USA Cycling Rule Book apply.
- All participants must sign a waiver/release form at registration. A parent or guardian who is present on-site must sign for participants under 18 years old.
- Race numbers may not be cut, folded, altered, or defaced in any way. If they are, the athlete will be disqualified and fined.
- · Please verify start times and other critical event issues when checking in at registration.
- · All information is subject to change. Please check this website frequently.
- · Click here for age group, start times, and distance.

AWARDS

- Professional Men's and Women's categories prize purse is \$3,000—shared by men and women equally, five deep. (Top five Pro Men and top five Pro Women each receive an equal portion of the \$3,000 prize purse.)
- . Awards presentations will be held on the Main Awards Stage for each category of race as that category finishes, and after the top three awards results are made final.

AWARDS DETAILS FOR ALL SOC RACES

- Preliminary results. All preliminary race results will be posted on or near the Main Awards Stage. Preliminary results will be posted within fifteen minutes of competition completion.
- · Protests. For protest rules and regulations, click here. Any protests must be filed with a designated protest official within fifteen minutes of preliminaryresults posting. No protests/changes/edits to race results will occur after the designated protest period. No exceptions.
- Complete final race results will be posted online at www.seaotterclassic.com by 11:59 p.m. of that race day.
- All podium winners (top three in each racing category) will receive a commemorative Sea Otter Classic medal.
- · Podium winners may receive merchandise from various Sea Otter sponsors.
- · Athletes must be in attendance at the Awards Ceremony to receive their prizes. Awards will not be mailed; no exceptions.
